Famous Italians

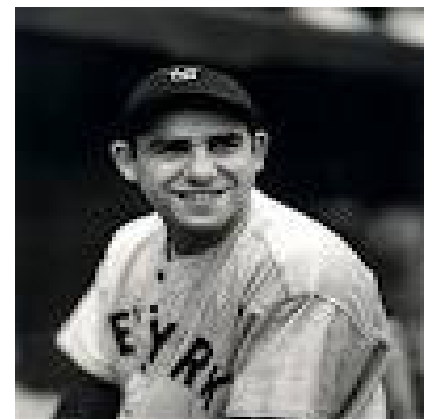
Lawrence "Yogi" Berra

Lawrence Peter "Yogi" Berra was a most unlikely looking athlete, but he was blessed with one of the game's most graceful swings. During the 19 years Berra played for the Yankees, they won 14 pennants.

There never was any question about his hitting. Often swinging at pitches far out of the strike zone, golfing line drives over the first baseman's head, he had 10 straight years with 20 or more home runs and 5 times knocked in over 100 runs in a sea-

son. A power hitter with a keen eye, he struck out just 12 times in 597 at bats in 1950. He was particularly dangerous in the late innings with men on base.

Yogi was voted the league's Most Valuable Player 3 times, in 1951, 1954, and 1955. Berra was one of the shrewdest handlers of pitchers and most deft defensive catchers in the game, once handling 950 chances over 148 straight games without an error, a major league record for catchers. He was inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame in 1972.

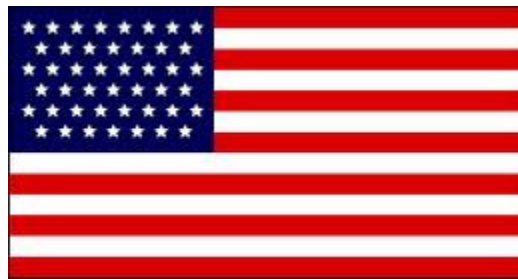
